All you have to do is make a copy of your favorite song and then tweak it a little to make it into the ringtone your iPhone can use. The ringtone must be 30 seconds or less, so you'll need to choose which part of the song you want to use. Start iTunes. If prompted, sign in with the same Apple ID and password you use for your iPhone. Drag a music file to your iTunes Music library or press Ctrl-O to import it. Search for a song in your music library or playlist. Right-click the file name and select Get Information. In the window that opens, click the Options tab. Select the check boxes next to the start time and stop time of the song, and change the times so that the song is shorter by 30 seconds. To start a song one minute, change the start time to 1:00 and the Stop time to 1:30. Click OK. Right-click the song again. This time, select Create AAC version and make a copy of the song in AAC format. If you don't see this option, you'll need to change your iTunes preferences (see next step). A duplicate 30-second version of the song appears in the Music library below the original. If you don't have the option to create a version of an AAC song, press Ctrl-B to reveal the iTunes menu bar. Then choose Preferences from the Edit menu, and then click Import Settings on the General tab. Click the Import with menu and select AAC Encoder. Double-click OK to close the preference windows. Right-click the original song file that still appears all the time, and then select Get Information again. Highlight and delete the start time and stop time, and then click OK. This returns the original song file to its normal length. Open Windows Control Panel, select Appearance and Personalization, and then click Folder Options. Click the Show tab, and then clear the Next to Hide extensions for known file types check box. You must be able to see the song file extension to make it a ringtone file. Right-click the 30-second version of the AAC song in iTunes, and then select Open in Windows Explorer. Right-click the file in Windows Explorer and select Highlight the .mp3 and replace it with the .m4r file extension that is used for ringtones. Press Enter. Click the menu button at the top of the corner of iTunes, which should say Music and select Tones.. This page displays new ringtones that indicate that you have changed the file extension correctly. Connect your iPhone to your computer using a USB cable. Select your iPhone when it appears in the upper right corner of the iTunes window. Click the Tones tab, and then click Sync Tones. When synchronization is complete, click Apply, and then click Sync to close iTunes and unplug the USB cable. Start Settings from the iPhone home screen. Slide down and touch Sounds. Slide down again and touch Ringtone. You can now select your own ringtone from the list of available options. When choosing a time, make sure that you have inserted the time in minutes and seconds. So if you want to start ringtones for 1 minute and 34 seconds, enter 1:34 into the start field. Then set it to the end 30 seconds later at 2:04. After choosing a time, be sure to play it to make sure it's the part of the song you really want.6 Click OK.7. With the song highlighted, click File & Convert, and choose an option that says Create AAC Version. Apple iTunes instantly converts the 30-second audio clip you just decided to create.8 Right-click the ring tone you just created, and on your Mac, choose Show in Finder. On a Windows PC, locate the song in the Windows Explorer pane and locate it on your hard drive.9. Change the song file extension from .m4a to .m4r. That's because Apple uses .m4r extensions for ringtones instead of .m4a. After to either .m4a or with .m4r, choose the second option.10. Leave the window open and plug your iPhone into iPhone.11 appears in the left sidebar of the screen. Drag the .m4r ringtone you just created to the option in the left sidebar, under your iPhone that saysTones. This should then be seen under the ringtones in the iPhone.12. Point to your iPhone and click Settings.13. Under Settings, choose Sounds and Haptice.14. Move down to Ringtone and tap this option.15. Here, you should see the ringtone. Select it.
